## One Solitary Life

Here is a man, born in an obscure village, child of a peasant woman. He worked in a carpenter's shop until he was thirty; then for three years he was an itinerant preacher. He never wrote a book, he never held an office. He never owned a home, he never had a family. He did none of those things we normally associate with greatness. He had no credentials but himself.

When he was still a young man the tide of popular opinion turned against him. His friends all ran away. He was turned over to his enemies. He went through the mockery of a trial. He was nailed to a cross between two thieves. While he was dying, his executioners gambled for the only piece of property he had on earth, and that was his coat. When he was dead, he was laid in a borrowed grave through the pity of a friend.

And yet... Some twenty centuries have come and gone, and today he remains the most influential figure of the human race. Indeed, I would be well within the mark to say that all the armies that ever marched, all the navies that ever sailed, all the parliaments that ever sat, all the kings that ever reigned, put together, have not affected the life of man upon this earth as has this one, solitary life.
