MEET OUR OPPONENTS



Rugby is a leading sport at Pangbourne College, with boys playing during the Michaelmas Term.

Pupils with all levels of abilities are catered for, including those who haven't played before.

We have an excellent team of coaches who focus on developing the core skills, but also developing the 'Pangbourne style' of play.

A balanced fixture card is organised against other schools, and teams play competitive matches on Saturdays and Wednesdays.

Players on the 1st XV team help lead Rugby Club coaching sessions and act as referees.

Pangbourne enters cup competitions including the Berkshire Cup (2nd XV and U14s) and the NatWest Schools Cup (1st XV and U15s).

During the Lent Term all pupils are offered the opportunity to pick rugby 7s alongside their main sport. This culminates in the Rosslyn Park National 7s, an event where we regularly reach the latter stages of the competition.



THE SEASON SO FAR

Shiplake College 20 The Oratory 9

An outstanding team defence and some good game management gave the 1st XV their first win of the season. Tries by Captain **H Kunzig** and winger **J Cheetham** were converted with pin point accuracy by **J Blacknell.** Final score Oratory 9 - Shiplake 20.

Shiplake College 33 Magdalen College School 12

We started strongly with a dominant forward pack and the centre pairing of J **Angell** and **J Rogers**. In wet and slippery conditions the handling and endeavour of the team was impressive. Excellent game management by A Arnold led to numerous tries with the final score 33-12 to Shiplake.

Shiplake College 31 UCS

Once again, Shiplake 1st XV imposed their dominance from KO on the set piece and ruck. After sustained pressure on the UCS try line. A Thomson scuttled over the line after six minutes. The second half was all Shiplake, **A Arnold** (24-5) crossing the try line with a lovely grubber and collect then N Floyd crossing 10 minutes later (31-5). Stand out game management by A Arnold once again. UCS scored some late consolation tries but the 1st XV continued to impress as they went into a much needed half term break.

TONIGHT'S CHARITY



Our chosen rugby charity is the Matt Hampson Foundation (MHF). This charity provides invaluable advice, support, relief and/or treatment for anyone who has suffered a serious injury or disability which has arisen from participation in sport or any other form of physical activity.

Matt Hampson was spinally injured in 2005 during an England Under 21 rugby training session. Since then, Matt has battled hard to live as normal a life as possible. Paralysed from the neck down and breathing via the aid of a ventilator, it is testament to him that he decided to set up the Foundation so that others who have suffered similar catastrophic injuries can receive support and assistance.

It has been Matt and the Foundation's big goal to build the Get Busy Living! Centre, a place where our beneficiaries can receive rehabilitation and meet others in a similar position who can pass on advice and inspire each other to move on with

their lives. That dream is now a reality and the Centre opened in October 2018.

The sharing of knowledge and experiences is a powerful tool in the rehabilitation process following a life changing injury. For many, waking up and facing another day is a battle in itself. The Foundation aims to create an environment to assist those facing new challenges in both theirs and their families lives. Our beneficiaries will also be able to benefit from physiotherapy, life skills and other alternative therapies.

To help raise awareness of this very worthy cause, the Shiplake 1st XV display the MHF logo on the front of their playing shirts and on the back of their white playing shorts.

We are delighted to be able to use this opportunity to highlight our support, and thank you for any generous donations when supporting rugby at Shiplake College.


